

The administration of Protective Services in the Military Forces better known as escorts is a Special Counterintelligence Operation assigned to Special Forces, Intelligence and Military Police Units. In Colombia it was the responsibility of Department E2 and later of DINTE


After the bloody takeover of the Palace of Justice by the M19 in 1985 with the patronage of the extraditable and the attack against General Samudio, the army organized the AFEAU with the support of the United States government. The DAS advised the Military Forces and Police on the management of the bodyguards and instructed the personnel assigned to such a mission at the Santander General School, based on the doctrine of the Department of State, Diplomatic Service and ICITAP of the United States and institutional experience. The General Command issued directive 089 of 87 to regulate the Military Escorts.






## PIE 120002 –TRANSITORY DIRECTIVE 00048/01








## DIGNATARIES AND VIP PROTECTION COURSES 1992/2013

Between 1992 and 2013 I instructed 150 First Level Escort Courses with 3.283 students, Level II Protective Intelligence 16 courses 401 students, Level III Executive Driving 4 courses 104 students, Level IV 3 courses 58 Students, Integrated course 1 course 20 escorts for a total of 3.866 operators.



In aspects of Antiterrorism, I gave 22 Crisis Management Seminars training 566 officials in the country and abroad (Costa Rica), 6 Asymmetric Warfare Seminars 200 Ensign at the General José Maria Cordova Military School; at OPSIC (School of Psychological Operations) ESREM (School of Military Civil Relations), ESMAI (School for International Missions and Integral Action) 92 courses on Subversion and Terrorism; Induction of Security with the ASEG Security Group of the General Command of the Armed Forces (1994-2013) 5,770 cadres and troop person were trained to guarantee the security of the complex of the Ministry of Defense in the CAN. At the end of the first decade of the century the Army organized a company and finally a Battalion of Military Police for Security and Protection.
